Dr. Michelle Larson's professional passion is to welcome everyone into the journey of scientific discovery by enabling engagement and communication between scientists and the public. Dr. Larson oversees a 21st century space science center that includes the institution's landmark museum and observatory complex; one of the world's leading collections documenting the history of astronomical science; and an award-winning digital platform that engages millions of people around the globe. Annually, more than 500,000

people visit the Adler on the shore of Lake Michigan, making it one of Chicago's leading attractions. Since Michelle joined the Adler Planetarium, the team has found new and innovative ways to meet people wherever they are and welcome them into the scientific community. The museum has expanded astronomy programming and partnerships in neighborhoods across Chicago; developed online experiences that engage people around the world through virtual field trips, sky observing hangouts, and even a space comedy show; and the Adler remains home to Earth's largest platform for citizen science, the Zooniverse—an online tool that connects researchers with millions of volunteers around the globe.

Michelle earned her PhD in physics from Montana State University, and enjoys making connections with people through science in everyday life. Don't be surprised if you end up speaking with her about rising cells of cream in your coffee, or protecting dark skies with responsible lighting choices. She also enjoys sharing the more spectacular objects of the night sky with the public through her telescope. A favorite highlight was when a young child exclaimed, "Wow! Saturn looks just like a Chevy symbol."

Michelle serves on several national and Chicago-area advisory boards, and lives just outside Chicago with her husband—who is also an astrophysicist—their daughter, and two cats.

Trisha Prabhu, Entrepreneur I Inventor I Change Agent

Trisha Prabhu is a 21-year-old innovator, social entrepreneur, global advocate and inventor of ReThink™, a patented technology and an effective way to detect and stop online hate. In the fall of 2013, Trisha, then just 13 years old, read the shocking news story of Rebecca Sedwick's suicide. After being cyberbullied for over a year and a half, Rebecca, a 12-year-old girl from Florida, took her own life. As a victim of harassment herself, Trisha was

shocked, heartbroken, and outraged - she couldn't be a bystander, and decided to be an Upstander. In response, Trisha created the patented technology product ReThink™, which detects and stops online hate at the source, before bullying occurs and the damage is done. Her globally acclaimed research has found that with ReThink, adolescents change their mind 93% of the time and decide not to post an offensive message.

As a social entrepreneur, Trisha has received worldwide acclaim in the business world. In 2016, President Obama and the U.S. State Department invited Trisha to the Global Entrepreneurship Summit, to showcase her work and share her story with other entrepreneurs. Not long after, ReThink was featured on ABC's hit T.V. show, Shark Tank. In 2019, ReThink was the Grand Prize Winner of Harvard University's President's Innovation Challenge. In 2020, Trisha was named one of the inaugural winners of the prestigious Elevate Prize, as well as an Adrian Cheng Fellow at Harvard Kennedy School's Social Innovation and Change Initiative. In 2021, she was the youngest honoree named to Forbes' 30 Under 30 Social Impact list.

Trisha is currently pursuing her undergraduate education at Harvard University in Cambridge, MA. She is originally from Naperville, Illinois.
